2. Items for Consideration and Approval

2.1 Conferment of UGC extension of autonomous status to the institute

The University Grants Commission, New Delhi has conferred the extension of autonomous status to the institute for a period of five years from the academic year 2022 - 2023 to 2026 - 2027 through vide reference, Lr. No. F-22-1/2022 (AC), dated 24.08.2022 of the additional secretary, UGC, New Delhi.

Institute also received the conferment of autonomous from the University through vide Procs. No. D1/960/2022, dated: 05.09.2022. The proceeding copies are enclosed in **Annexure - III**.

Resolution: The board noted and acknowledged the conferment of extension of autonomous status.

2.2 Faculty requirement for the academic year 2023 - 24

The faculty requirement for the academic year 2023 - 24 is presented by considering the increase in intake, introduction of new courses. The faculty student ratio considered for the calculation of faculty requirement is 1:20 as per the norms of the JNT University Hyderabad and AICTE, New Delhi.

Resolution: The board suggested to submit the audited statements of expenditure and income for the financial year 2022-23 in the next meeting. The members also informed the finance officer to have required number of schedules / headers in the audit statement as per NAAC/NBA and other statutory bodies.

2.5 Consideration and approval for shifting of ECE/EEE faculty to CSE / CSE allied departments

As per the guidelines of the affiliating University, the affiliating colleges are permitted to engage faculty with specialization in interdisciplinary branches not exceeding 10% of the total faculty strength in the discipline concerned, vide ref. Cir. No. UAAC / Faculty / Eligibility / 2021, dated: 27-07-2021.

- As per the guidelines of JNTUH, the faculty of ECE / EEE with M.Tech / Ph.D with two NPTEL courses in CSE are eligible for consideration of SCM in B.Tech CSE against 10% of faculty positions. For such faculty, it is also proposed for a salary hike of Rs. 5000 per month.
- It is also requested to consider the faculty who completes the MOOCs in Computer Science Department with 20 credits from AICTE NPTEL Swayam in CSE/IT and CSE allied departments. It is also proposed to consider such faculty as full-time faculty in the department.

The details of the faculty completed the AICTE Swayam / NPTEL MOOC courses, department and subject wise are enclosed in **Annexure - IV**.

Resolution: The board noted and suggested to follow the guidelines of JNT University. The board permitted to shift these faculty to B.Tech - CSE / CSE allied departments and recruit additional faculty in their parent department in place of these faculty as per the rules of statutory bodies.

2.6 Consideration and approval for research centers furtherance in ME, CSE, ECE and permission to apply for research centers in CE, EEE & AE departments.

Principal has presented the progress report of the existing research centers to the board. The report consists of the following:

- Increase in the research publications in the quality journals / conferences
- Research collaboration with other universities
- Student's publications and collaborative projects in various centers of the institute
- Faculty contribution in IPRs etc.
- Faculty enrolment for Ph.D programs and
- Increased number of supervisors recognized by JNTUH and other Universities etc.

Resolution: The board expressed their satisfaction on the progress report of the research centers and permitted to submit the applications for recognition of research centers in CE, EEE, AE, ME, CSE and ECE departments to JNTUH.

2.7 Review on Research policy including SEED money for research, ideation & product development and incentives for citations

The institute is actively supporting the faculty and students by providing SEED funding for research and product developments. Principal has proposed the following initiatives in providing the SEED money and incentive mechanisms before the board.

Fund towards ideation and product development:

A fund of up to Rs. 2.5 lakhs for product development and up to Rs. 7.5 lakhs for commercialization and a fellowship of Rs. 5,000 per months in incubation period for all the eligible students. The faculty are supported with a seed fund of Rs. 5 lakhs from ideation level to venture creation.

SEED money:

Depending on the quality of research proposals, up to 15 faculty members per academic year will be approved to receive seed money for a tune of upto Rs. 25,00,000/-. However, this is not a constraint for high potential and cross-disciplinary research partnerships.

Professional body memberships:

Institute encourages the students, faculty for active involvement in professional bodies which will enrich the student's academics, professional and personality development skills through various

programs, activities. The following activities are proposed at the institute level. It is also proposed to provide 50% registration fee to the faculty and students.

- Establishment of institute chapters
- Individual faculty / student enrollment
- Student chapters

Principal also proposed the following amendments in the 'Research Policy'.

Modifications in the existing policy (shown in red color):

- 7.1 Journal articles and conference papers published in refereed Scopus and SCI/ESCI/SCIE indexed journals or proceedings under Engineering subject category (Engineering / Computer Science / Materials Science / Energy / Chemical Engineering) are eligible for incentive grant.
- 7.3 An incentive of Rs. 20,000/- shall be granted for the publication in refereed Scopus / WOS indexedJournal.
- 7.4 The open access refereed Scopus indexed article publication in less than 1 impact factor journals will be granted with an incentive of Rs. 15,000/-.
- 7.5 Rs.2000/- shall be granted per faculty for every citation made in his/her publication from the list of publications supporting the improvement of institute h-index.
- 7.17 The registration fee for the MOOC courses completed by the students / faculty is reimbursed to the tune of upto Rs. 2000/- if they are linked to institute chapter (SPOC) while registration.

Resolution: The board unanimously approved the seed money for research, ideation and product development, incentive mechanism as proposed and amendments in the existing research policy with immediate effect. The revised research policy is enclosed in **Annexure - V.**

2.8 Approval and consideration of institute's policies and standard operating procedures

The ex-officio highlighted the institute's policies and Standard Operating Procedures (SOP). - Energy management policy should be revamped with the recent technologies for effective implementation in the institute.
- The mentoring policy is modified by adding the recent practices undertaken by the institute.
- The Innovation and start-up policy, is modified to facilitate the incubates at the institute.

The eligibility criterion for ELs proposed is as below:

EARNED LEAVES (EL) - appended in 'Administrative HR policy' at page no. 11.

- a. All staff members earn 3 days of EL per year of service.
- b. The quantum of earned leaves are admissible based on the date of joining their service on prorating basis.
- c. Earned leaves will be credited to their account in the month of January on completion of each year of service.
- d. The staff is permitted to surrender in multiples of 15 days of EL accumulated beyond 9 ELs in a year and apply for encashment of the same. The cash equivalent to a maximum of 30 days will be allowed. However, the staff who tender resignation or whose services are terminated will not be eligible for encashment balance of EL, to their credit.
- e. Balance of ELs cannot be utilized on submission of resignation.
- f. Earned Leaves encashment Formula = [(75% of Gross Pay) / 30] * No of ELs
- g. Staff member can avail the ELs only after accumulating beyond 9 ELs in their account.
- h. Any staff member can avail ELs only after prior approval by the principal.

CASUAL LEAVE (CL) - appended in 'Administrative HR policy' at page no. 10

The total number of days of CL permitted is 15 in a calendar year.

Resolution: The board unanimously ratified the eligibility criterion of ELs and revised administrative HR policy.

3.8 | Institute scholarships for the academic year 2023-24.
